ALABAMA – CLIMATE

The state is classified as humid subtropical (Cfa) under the Köppen climate classification.[1] The average annual temperature is 64 °F (18 °C). Temperatures tend to be warmer in the southern part of the state with its proximity to the Gulf of Mexico, while the northern parts of the state, especially in the Appalachian Mountains in the northeast, tend to be slightly cooler.[2] Generally, Alabama has very hot summers and mild winters with copious precipitation throughout the year. Alabama receives an average of 56 inches (1,400 mm) of rainfall annually and enjoys a lengthy growing season of up to 300 days in the southern part of the state.[2] Hailstorms occur occasionally in the spring and summer, but are seldom destructive. Heavy fogs are rare, and are confined chiefly to the coast. Thunderstorms occur throughout the year - they are most common in the summer, but most severe in the spring and fall, when destructive winds and tornadoes occasionally occur. Hurricanes are quite common in the state, especially in the southern part, and major hurricanes occasionally strike the coast which can be very destructive.

Summers in Alabama are among the hottest in the United States, with high temperatures averaging over 90 °F (32 °C) throughout the summer in some parts of the state. The heat of summer is tempered in the south by the winds from the Gulf of Mexico, and in the north by the elevation above the sea. The average annual temperature is highest in the southwest along the coast, and lowest in the northeast among the highlands. Thus at Mobile the annual mean is 67 °F (19 °C), the mean for the summer 81 °F (27 °C); and at Valley Head, in De Kalb county, the mean for the summer 75 °F (24 °C). At Montgomery, in the central region, the average annual temperature is 66 °F (19 °C), with a summer average of 81 °F (27 °C). The highest temperature ever recorded was 109 °F (43 °C) in Talladega county in 1902. Winters are generally mild in Alabama, as they are throughout most of the southeastern United States, with average January low temperatures around 40 °F (4 °C) in Mobile, around 31 °F (-1 °C) in Huntsville, around 36 °F (2 °C) in Montgomery, and around 33 °F (1 °C) in Birmingham.

The amount of precipitation is greatest along the coast (62 inches/1,574 mm) and evenly distributed through the rest of the state (about 52 inches/1,320 mm). Much of the rainfall is produced by thunderstorms and, occasionally, by Hurricanes and other tropical disturbances.

- **U.S. Space & Rocket Center – Huntsville**

- **Birmingham Zoo – Birmingham**

At Predator Zone, visitors will see zookeepers conduct training sessions on a daily basis through commands. This interaction serves as another tool for zookeepers to monitor the animals' health and well-being on a regular basis. - **McWane Science Center – Birmingham**

- **USS Alabama Battleship Memorial Park – Mobile**
- Explore the mighty battleship, winner of 9 battle stars in World War II. See Mach 3 A-12 Blackbird supersecret spy plane and B-52 stratofortress Calamity Jane, submarine USS DRUM, an original plane that was used by the Tuskegee Airmen, plus 22 other aircraft and weaponry from all branches of military.
- **Barber Vintage Motorsports Museum – Birmingham**
- George Barber raced, modified, and maintained Porsches in the 1960's (63 first-place wins). He started collecting and restoring classic sports cars in 1989, but his interest soon turned to motorcycles. Mr. Barber recognized that there was not a museum which reflected the history of motorcycles around the world. He wanted to preserve motorcycle history in the United States in a way that represents an international aspect and to supply an example of motorcycles that until then could only have been seen in books and magazines. This was the theme used in the development of the Barber collection. An interesting aspect of the collection is that restorations are done in-house.
- **Huntsville Botanical Garden – Huntsville**
- Come by and visit the gift shop, tea room, picnic areas and pavilion. Seasonal Butterfly House, Spring Festival of Flowers and Scarecrow. Enjoy 112 acres of beautiful gardens and walking paths.

- **Point Mallard Park – Decatur**
- This 750-acre park has camping, hiking trails, biking trails and a golf course. The Aquatic Center features a wave pool, Olympic-size diving pool, water slides and kiddie pools. The park also features a year-round ice skating complex.
- **Montgomery Zoo – Montgomery**
- The Montgomery Zoo is 40 acres of habitats from five continents with naturalistic, barrier-free exhibits and more than 600 animals. Enjoy dining at the Overlook Cafe, visit the gift shop and take a train ride around the park to get the complete experience.
- **EarlyWorks Museum Complex – Huntsville**
