MONTANA – CLIMATE

Although it can get extremely cold in Montana, due in part to Montana's northern location, there is a great deal of diversity in state's weather. In fact, Montana is seldom consistently cold or hot. The state's low humidity translates into temperatures that are neither oppressively hot nor cold. Average daytime temperatures vary from 28 degrees in January to 84.5 degrees in July.

Rainfall is generally light, with most falling between May and July. Average rainfall for the western part of the state is 18 inches a year; 13 inches for the east. During July and August brief mid-day thunderstorms are a common, and the heavy downpours cool the late afternoon temperatures. Sometimes these storms are severe such as hailstorms that cause crop and property damage.

In the spring and early summer months when the snow in the mountains begins to melt Montana's river's swell with run-off. Heavy rains falling during the spring thaw constitute a serious flood threat. Ice jams during in the rivers during the spring can also cause flooding.

• **Yellow Stone National Park**

- Named the number one adventure vacation in the nation by US News and World Report, Yellowstone National Park is truly a playground for all ages. Established in 1872, and covering 2.2 million acres, Yellowstone National Park is the obvious namesake of Montana's Yellowstone Country. Populated by a large variety of wildlife, including both grizzly and black bears, moose, elk, bison, wolves, eagles and a number of other species, it also provides the backdrop for a large number of geologic and geothermal features, such as geysers, hot springs, rivers, waterfalls and canyons that are the iconic signatures of the park. The park is home to more than 300 different species of birds and its blue-ribbon streams and rivers host Brook, Brown, Cutthroat and Rainbow trout. <http://visityellowstonecountry.com/yellowstone-park>

• **Benton Lake National Wildlife Refuge Park- Great Falls, MT**

- Benton Lake National Wildlife Refuge covering 12,383 acres (19 square miles) is located on the western edge of the northern Great Plains, 50 miles east of the Rocky Mountains and 12 miles north of Great Falls. Despite its name, Benton Lake is actually a 5,000-acre shallow wetland created by the last continental glacier thousands of years ago. Benton Lake is an oasis for water birds. During spring and fall migrations, up to 150,000 ducks, 2,500 Canada geese, 40,000 snow geese, 5,000 tundra swans, and perhaps as many as 50,000 shorebirds use the marsh. Bald eagles are commonly seen in spring and fall, while an occasional golden eagle, prairie falcon, or peregrine falcon adds a bit of drama to the scene. • **Archie Bray Foundation for the Ceramic Arts- Helena, MT**

- Over sixty years ago, Archie Bray, Sr. founded what is known as the Pottery on the grounds of his brickyard, the Western Clay Manufacturing Company. Dedicated to the enrichment of the ceramic arts and providing an atmosphere of creative excellence for ceramic artists since 1951. Ceramic artists from around the world travel to Helena to work and study as they enrich their creative and artistic talents. The Bray sells pottery and sculpture, and also offers classes, workshops and exhibitions for the public. • **A Carousel for Missoula- Missoula, MT**

- A Carousel for Missoula is one of the first fully hand-carved carousels to be built in the United States since the Great Depression. From little more than dreams,

hard work and love, a carousel was created by hundreds of volunteers. The Carousel has 38 horses and two chariots.
