Nevada – CLIMATE

Nevada's climate is sunny and dry, with wide variation in daily temperatures. The normal daily temperature at Reno is 49°F (9°C), ranging from 32°F (0°C) in January to 69°F (21°C) in July. The all-time high, 125°F (52°C), was set at Laughlin on 29 June 1994; the record low, -50°F (-46°C), at San Jacinto on 8 January 1937.

Nevada is the driest state in the US, with overall average annual precipitation (1971–2000) of 7.5 in (19 cm) at Reno. Snowfall is abundant in the mountains, however, reaching 60 in (152 cm) a year on the highest peaks.

- **The Bellagio Fountains- Las Vegas, NV**
 - The fountains put on their show -- wonderfully timed to music choreography - every 15 minutes or so after dark and last for a few minutes. It's very pretty and lasts for the duration of the song. Stay for many other songs, especially the Michael Jackson one. The water streams move in the Jackson way. Don't go on high wind day, not only you get wet, the show may be stopped for that reason. There is plenty to see at the Bellagio, so time your visit so that you can pick up at least two fountain displays.
- **Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area- Las Vegas, NV**
 - Red Rock Canyon was designated as Nevada's first National Conservation Area. Red Rock Canyon is located 17 miles west of the Las Vegas Strip on Charleston Boulevard/State Route 159. The area is 195,819 acres and is visited by more than one million people each year. In marked contrast to a town geared to entertainment and gaming, Red Rock offers enticements of a different nature including a 13-mile scenic drive, more than 30 miles of hiking trails, rock climbing, horseback riding, mountain biking, road biking, picnic areas, nature observing and visitor center with exhibit rooms and a book store.
- **Titanic: The Artifact Exhibition- Las Vegas, NV**
 - The Titanic Artifact Exhibition is an unprecedented opportunity to travel back in time and experience the wonder and tragedy of the world's most famous ocean-liner, Titanic. Viewed by more than 25 million people worldwide, the Exhibition is one of the highest attended in history. Over 250 authentic artifacts recovered from the wreck site of Titanic, as well as extensive recreations of some of the most famous rooms from the Ship, make this an educational and entertaining experience perfect for all ages.
- **National Automobile Museum- Reno, NV**
 - Visit the National Automobile Museum offers more than 224 vehicles on display; this museum contains one of the greatest car collections anywhere.
- **Animal Ark- Reno, NV**
 - Animal Ark is a wildlife sanctuary that inspires environmental stewardship through wildlife education. The Animal Ark provides a safe haven for injured and non-releasable wildlife. There are special events like Raptor adventures every spring, cheetah runs and wolf howls that each visitor can experience.
- **Truckee River Walk- Reno, NV**
 - The Mission of the River walk Merchants Association is to increase year-round traffic and business for River walk Merchants while creating and nurturing a vibrant and safe downtown district. To celebrate and support Reno's diversity in the arts, its cultural and historic heritage and contribute to the growth, education and diversity of vital downtown shopping and entertainment for locals and visitors.
- **Nevada State Museum- Carson City, NV**
 - This museum focuses on the rich natural and cultural heritage of the "Silver State." Visit to learn about local wildlife, see the bones of pre-historic creatures found in the area and the Ichthyosaur Shonisaurus popularis, Nevada's state fossil.
- **Nevada State Railroad Museum- Carson City, NV**
 - Train buffs will love this museum which features a diverse collection of photographs and artifacts that trace Nevada's railroad history. Highlights include a 19th-century rail equipment exhibit and five steam locomotives.
- **Stewart Indian Cultural Center- Carson City, NV**
 - Once a school that taught Native Americans how to get along in "the white man's world," this cultural center now houses a fascinating collection of Native American art including the work of photographer E.S. Curtis
